Supp. 588 (D.S.C. 1997), and 149 F.3d 303 (4th Cir. 1998).

American Canoe Association, Inc. v. Murphy Farms, Inc., 326 F.3d 505 (4th Cir. 2003), a citizen suit under the Clean Water Act against a hog farm (a concentrated animal feeding operation (CAFO)) for discharging hog waste without a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit

(NPDES). The resulting permit, which imposed restrictions on operations to prevent discharges of hog waste, was the first NPDES permit issued to a CAFO in North Carolina. The other case decisions by the Fourth Circuit are found at 412 F.3d 536 (4th Cir. 2005), and 210 F.3d 360 (4th Cir. 2000). The district court's only decision is available at 1998 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 21402, 1998 WL 35273684 (E.D.N.C. Dec. 22, 1998).

PPG Industries, Inc., a citizen suit under RCRA's imminent and substantial endangerment provision and under the CWA for discharging pollutants into the Allegheny River and other waters of the United States since 1973 without authorization through an NPDES permit. Interfaith Community Organization v. Honeywell International, Inc., 426 F.3d 694 (3d Cir. 2005) and 726 F.3d 403 (3d Cir. 2013), citizen suits under RCRA where the court of appeals addresses the award of attorneys' fees to the citizen plaintiffs.

Interfaith Community Organization v. Shinn, No. 93-4774, slip op. (D.N.J. Nov. 24, 1998), a citizen suit under RCRA's imminent and substantial endangerment provision, in which the court found that the contaminants in Liberty State Park may present an imminent and substantial endangerment to park visitors. Almost 300 acres of the park have been fenced and closed to the public as a result. Remediation plans are underway by the State.

NJPIRG v. Hercules, Inc., 830 F. Supp. 1525 (D.N.J. 1993), rev'd in part and remanded, 50 F.3d 1239 (3d Cir. 1995), in which the courts addressed

the scope of a notice of intent to sue under the CWA. Additional district court decisions are at *PIRG v. Hercules, Inc.*, No. 89-2291, slip op. (D.N.J. Nov. 4, 1996) (reported at 44 ERC 1509); *PIRG v. Hercules, Inc.*, 970 F.Supp. 363 (D.N.J.1997); *PIRG v. Hercules, Inc.*, No. 89-2291, 2003 WL 23519620 (D.N.J. Oct. 27, 2003) (settled while on appeal of this decision).

NJPIRG v. Powell Duffryn Terminals, Inc., 720 F. Supp. 1158 (D.N.J. 1989), aff'd in part, rev'd in part and remanded, 913 F.2d 64 (3rd Cir. 1990), certiorari denied, 498 U.S. 1109 (1991), in which the court enjoined the defendant's violation of the CWA and imposed a penalty of \$4.085 million.

NJPIRG v. Monsanto Co., 600 F. Supp. 1479 (D.N.J. 1985), in which the court found the defendant liable for numerous violations of the CWA. This was the first summary judgment on the issue of liability in a CWA citizen suit. The court also upheld the constitutionality of the citizen suit provision of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1365.

NJPIRG v. Fritzsche, Dodge & Olcott, Inc., 579 F. Supp. 1528 (D.N.J. 1984), *aff'd*, 759 F.2d 1131 (3d Cir. 1985), in which the court held that agency level enforcement by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency did not bar plaintiffs' citizen suit under the CWA language at the time.

DL v. District of Columbia, 860 F.3d 713 (D.C. Cir. 2017) and 924 F.3d 585 (D.C. Cir. 2019), a class action on behalf of pre-school aged children with disabilities, in which the court of appeals rendered decisions regarding class certification, injunctive relief, and attorneys' fees.

Charles H. v. District of Columbia, No. 1:21-cv-997, 2022 WL 1416645 (D.D.C. Feb. 16, 2022), a class action on behalf of students with disabilities denied special education and related services while detained at the DC Jail, in which the district court found the District of Columbia to be in contempt of its preliminary injunction requiring delivery of the required services.
